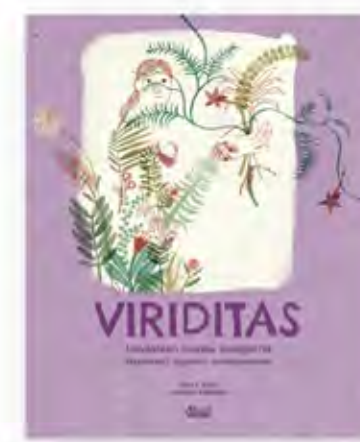
**Orangutans and me**
